A letter from more than 250 climate, labour, health and faith organizations from 30 countries calling for regulating Canada's oil and gas industry with a strong emissions cap

Dear Prime Minister Trudeau, Ministers Guilbeault, Wilkinson and Freeland,

Before this summer had even begun, the land currently called Canada was engulfed in flames. Almost every province and territory of the country has seen active wildfires, displacing communities and destroying ecosystems. As of mid-September, over 17 million hectares have burned – more than six times the normal amount. Indigenous communities are disproportionately affected, their lives and livelihoods turned to ashes, while often receiving less support from colonial governments. Close to 200,000 people have placed on an evacuation order, and many still don't know if they have homes to return to. Meanwhile, millions across the country are breathing air polluted with smoke particles. Smoke-filled skies also enveloped U.S. cities from New York to Washington, DC, and smoke travelled as far away as Norway.

The devastating reality of a more intense and longer wildfire season is a result of climate change: warmer and drier conditions make it quicker and easier for fires to start within vegetation and spread – whether they are caused by lightning, accident or arson. Human-caused climate change made record-breaking temperatures in Western Canada – which set the conditions for the wildfires – ten times more likely, according to preliminary data from Environment and Climate Change Canada. And the root cause of climate change is the elephant in Canada's climate policy room: the continued expansion of the production and consumption of fossil fuels.

A recent <u>peer-reviewed study from the Union of Concerned Scientists</u> found that 37% of the total area scorched by forest fires in the western United States and southwestern Canada since 1986 can be attributed to the 88 largest fossil fuel producers and cement manufacturers.

These impacts in Canada mirror the devastating losses and damages we are seeing every day around the world, exacerbated by Canadian oil and gas extraction. The Canadian government's failure to constrain the continued expansion of oil and gas has a direct impact on the lives of communities and ecosystems, both at home and worldwide.



This science makes it crystal clear: fossil fuel companies are pouring fuel on the fire. They have known about the climate-damaging impacts of their products for decades, have failed to act, and are continuing to undermine and block climate action. Despite record profits, oil and gas companies aren't investing in meaningful actions to cut emissions. Instead, they launch PR blitzes and raise CEOs bonuses. Time is running out to prevent the worst of climate catastrophes.

Canada is one of the world's biggest polluters, as well as the largest oil and gas producers and exporters – and it's lagging well behind other G7 countries on cutting emissions, held back by the outsized carbon footprint of the oil and gas industry. The sector accounts for <u>almost 30% of Canada's domestic emissions</u>, and grew by 89% between 1990 and 2021 – all while other sectors of the Canadian economy reduced their emissions.

Right now, Canada has a make-or-break moment to cap the rising oil and gas emissions that fuel devastating climate impacts like wildfires. The international community is watching closely: Canada must lead with a strong, ambitious cap that will rein in its biggest polluters. This cap should be aligned with Canada's fair share of the global effort to limit warming to 1.5°C and cut the sector's emissions by 60% below 2005 levels by 2030, with zero compliance flexibility, offsets and loopholes. This cap is Canada's best chance to meet its 2030 commitment. Without these elements of a strong cap, Canada will likely fail to meet its 2030 target and renege on its legally-binding international climate commitments. This is not an option. Canada cannot claim to be a climate leader unless it tackles its emissions problem.

As a major oil and gas exporter, Canada must use every tool in its toolkit to align itself with the global energy transition and immediately end the expansion of fossil fuel production and infrastructure. The upcoming Climate Ambition Summit held by the United Nations Secretary-General offers an opportunity for "First Movers and Doers" to step up. For Canada to live up to these expectations, this needs to include:

- Phasing out fossil fuel subsidies, including public finance for fossil fuels, while avoiding higher energy costs for equity-deserving communities who are already dealing with energy poverty;
- Enacting a windfall tax on oil and gas profits;
- Ensuring that the Sustainable Jobs Act <u>affirms Indigenous peoples' sovereignty, treats Indigenous Nations as equitable partners in planning for the future of their lands and people</u>, and respects the International Labour Organization's guidelines on a Just Transition.

We urge you to make the most of this opportunity to show responsibility and take decisive, effective action for a safer, healthier future.
